INTRODUCTION

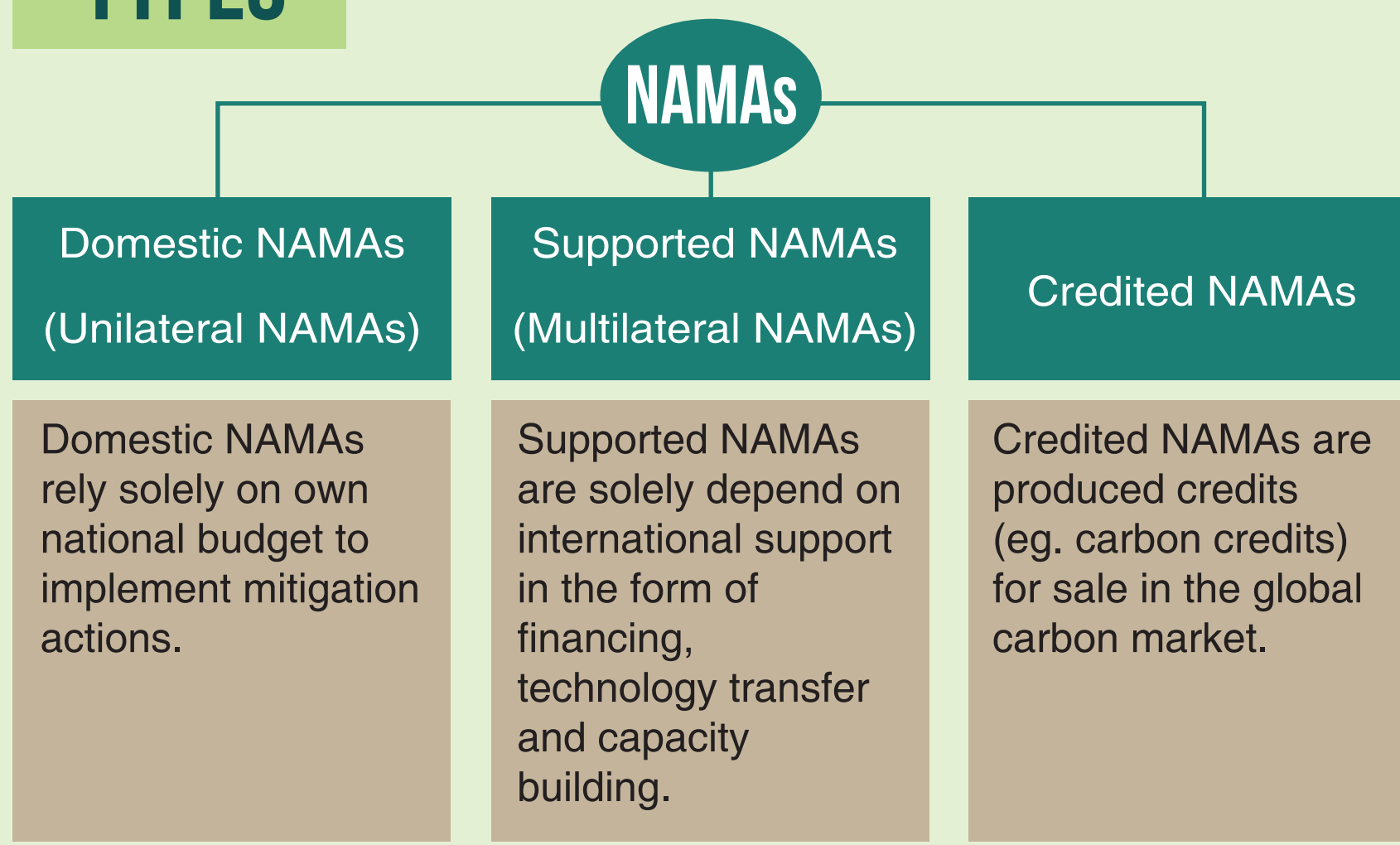
Nationally Appropriate Mitigation Actions (NAMAs) is one of mechanisms for GHG emission reduction which can be applied by the developing countries established through UN Climate Change negotiation process.

The term NAMA first came up in the Bali Action Plan in 2007 and developing countries agreed to develop NAMAs in the context of Sustainable Development, supported and enabled by technology, financing and capacity building in a measurable, reportable and verifiable (MRV) manner.

All parties (Public, Private, NGOs, Individuals) are encouraged to obtain this benefits and contribute to this global effort of GHG reduction.

There are three types of NAMAs as follows;

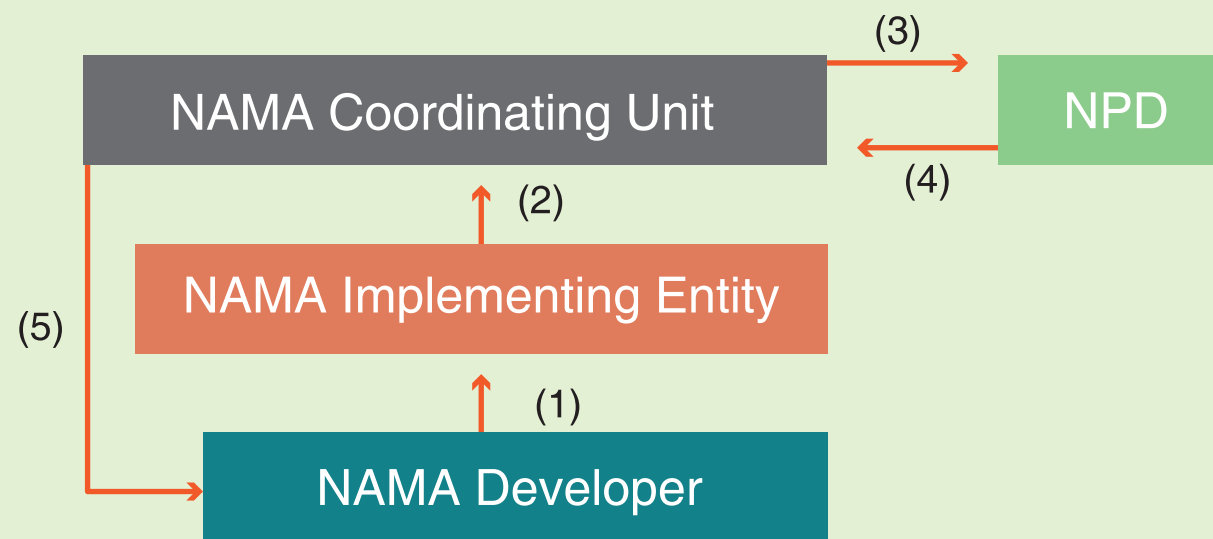


POTENTIAL SECTORS



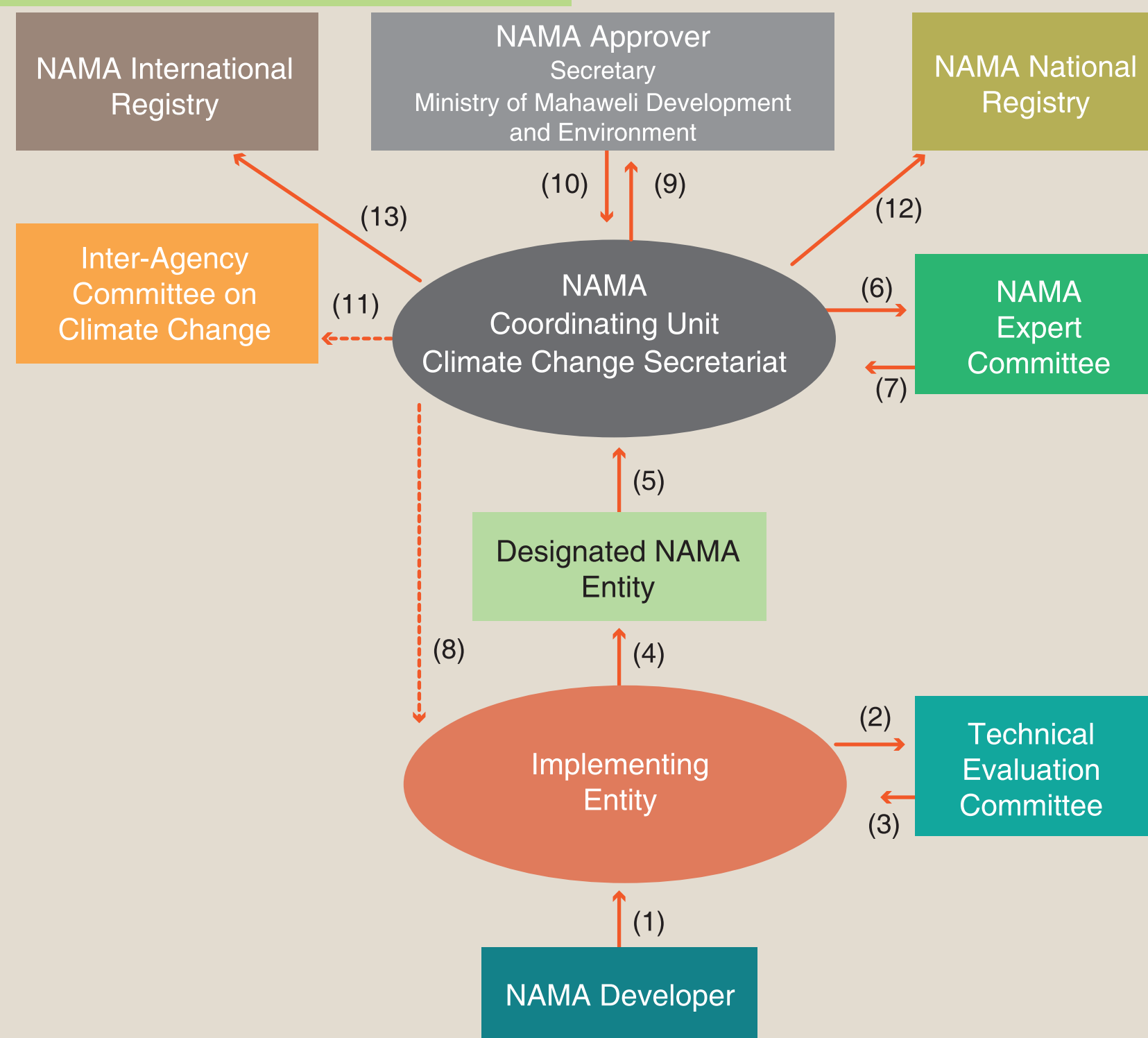
NAMA APPROVAL PROCESS

1. PROJECT CONCEPT:



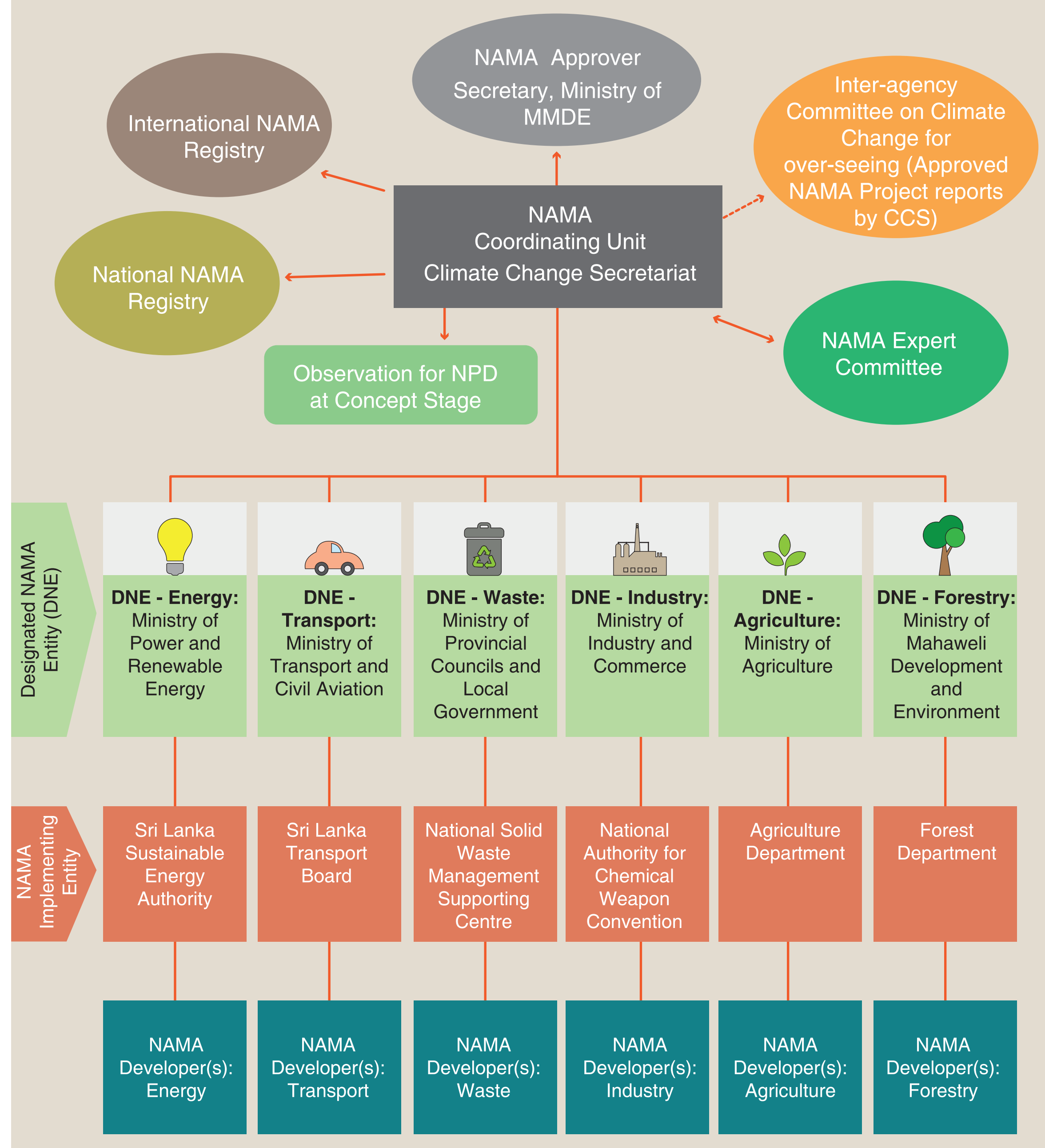
- Where;
- Submit NAMA Concept Note in the given standard format
 - Submit to the NAMA Coordinating Unit
 - Submit to National Planning Department to check for duplication and national priorities
 - Made Recommendations
 - In-Principle approval/Rejection/Improvements

2. PROJECT PROPOSAL:



- Where;
- Submit the detailed project proposal in the given standard format
 - Submit to the Technical Evaluation Committee for screening
 - Made recommendations
 - Submit to the Designated NAMA Entity
 - Submit to the NAMA Coordinating Unit
 - Submit to the NAMA expert committee for deep evaluation
 - Made Recommendations
 - Based on the recommendations, rejection or further improvements
 - Submit to the NAMA Approver
 - Grant approvals
 - Report to Inter-Agency Committee on Climate Change
 - Registered Approved NAMA in National Registry
 - Registered Approved NAMA in International Registry
